

Go Hwy 27 North out of Armuchee. Turn right onto Gore-Subligna Road beside the service station. Keep going down this road until you come to the Subligna General Store (white store, no other stores around so it's hard to miss). Turn right onto the road and we can't remember what this road is called (should have looked yesterday). Travel down the road for a few miles and you will see Forestry Road 226 on the right (gravel road). It's the first gravel road to the right on the paved road straight across from a pasture. There may be a small forestry sign on the road besides the road marker. I wish they had a bigger sign. Turn right onto the gravel road, follow it winding up and down and around, when it forks, stay left up the hill, you will come down the hill and see a creek to your right and a primitive camping area, keep going up the next hill and you will see Dry Creek Equestrian Trailhead parking area on the right. It's \$5 per day use only, they have bathrooms, bear proof garbage boxes, and a picnic area. There is no water but the creek is nearby. When you leave the parking area on horseback, go right down the gravel road and you will see many illegal trails (most cross the Pinhoti) - the Pinhoti is well marked and you will see different routes to get onto it from the gravel road.
